

California - CCPA	Businesses must enter into a written contract with a service provider that prohibits the service provider from:
Businesses and Service Providers	☐ 1. Selling or sharing the Personal information. ☐ 2. Retaining, using, or disclosing the Personal information for any purpose other than for the Business purposes specified in the contract for the business. ☐ 3. Retaining, using, or disclosing the information outside of the direct business relationship between the Service provider and the business. ☐ 4. Combining the Personal information that the Service provider receives from, or on behalf of, the business with Personal information that it receives from, or on behalf of, another Person, or Collects from its own interaction with the Consumer, provided that the service provider may combine Personal information to perform any Business purpose as defined in Regulations except for providing Advertising and marketing Services.

The contract may, subject to agreement with the Service provider, permit the business to monitor the Service provider's compliance with the contract through measures including, but not limited to, ongoing manual reviews and automated scans and regular assessments, audits, or other technical and operational testing at least once every 12 months.☐ 6. Identify the specific Business purposes for which the Service provider is Processing Personal information pursuant to the written contract with the business, and specify that the business is disclosing the Personal information to the Service provider only for the limited and specified Business purpose(s) set forth within the contract.☐ 7. Require the Service provider to comply with all Applicable Sections of the CCPA and these regulations.☐ 8. Require the Service provider to notify the business after it makes a determination that it can no longer meet its obligations under the CCPA and these regulations☐ 9. Grant the business the right, upon notice, to take reasonable and appropriate steps to stop and remediate the Service provider or Contractor's unauthorized use of Personal information. |

Require the Service provider to enable the business to comply with Consumer requests made pursuant to the CCPA or require the business to inform the Service provider of any Consumer request made pursuant to the CCPA that they must comply with and provide the information necessary for the Service provider to comply with the request.
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
